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Diagnosing and Managing Obstructive Sleep Apnea in Primary Care

This in-depth, 3-part educational series has been developed specifically for primary care physicians involved in the diagnosis and management of patients with Obstructive Sleep Apnea. Each program in the series includes a presentation which reviews diagnosis and treatment options for Obstructive Sleep Apnea and the application of these skills in the primary care setting. At the conclusion of each presentation, an expert panel expands on concepts, issues, and considerations most relevant to the physicians who diagnose and treat patients with Obstructive Sleep Apnea. The series consists of

1. *Presentation and Diagnosis of OSA in Primary Care* _____ reviews the epidemiology and impact of Obstructive Sleep Apnea, risk factors and consequences, and commonly associated co-morbidities.
2. *OSA and the Principles of Therapy* _____ explains Obstructive Sleep Apnea risk stratification and the implications for selecting an appropriate treatment approach.
3. *Management of OSA from a Primary Care Perspective* _____ addresses management issues most relevant to the primary care audience. Faculty offer guidance on counseling patients before polysomnography and during treatment, how and when to prescribe CPAP, and managing complications and compliance issues.
